Preamble:

The INTERREG Caribbean program supports structuring projects that provide a concerted response to issues shared by the territories and populations of the cooperation area.

The COVID19 pandemic and its health, economic and social consequences have once again brought to light the relevance and need for operational cooperation on a regional scale.

In this context, and on the occasion of the launch of the Call for Expression of Interest no.2, the INTERREG Caribbean program aims to support projects susceptible to increase the territories' resilience in the face of a major scale health crisis.





1- INTERREG Caribbean program presentation:

1.1 – Overall presentation:

INTERREG Caribbean is a European program that accompanies Guadeloupe, French Guiana, Martinique and Saint Martin, French and European territories, in the implementation of cooperation actions with their neighbors in the Greater Caribbean, i.e. more than 35 countries in an area that encompasses Mexico to the north and Venezuela to the south.

The Managing Authority is the Regional Council of Guadeloupe, which implements this program in the partnership governance framework with institutions of France, Guadeloupe, French Guiana, Martinique, Sint Maarten as well as regional international organizations (OECS, CARIFORUM, ACS, OCTA). These different partners have defined the program's cooperation strategy and select the projects that are to be supported (they make up the program's selection committee).

1.2 – The partnership, the key to an INTERREG Caribbean project:

The partnership of an INTERREG Caribbean project must mandatorily foresee:

- A lead partner (in charge of the project's administrative and financial coordination) located in Guadeloupe, French Guiana, Martinique or Saint-Martin;

a partner located in a non-European territory of the Caribbean, *a minima*. The partners of an INTERREG Caribbean project are engaged in a common project (the project must be co-constructed, the participation of each partner is motivated) and "win-win" (which will benefit each partner). The program authorities shall stick to these characteristics upon project selection.

Thus, the projects must be in line with two of the following four cooperation criteria:

- be jointly developed;
- be jointly implemented;
- benefit from cooperation in staffing;
- be jointly financed.

1.3 - A program divided into two geographic strands:

The cooperation actions are distributed into two geographical strands:

- a cross-border strand, for which only project holders located in Guadeloupe, Martinique or in an OECS country or territory are eligible;
- **a transnational strand**, which concerns project holders located in Guadeloupe, French Guiana, Martinique, Saint Martin or in the Greater Caribbean.

1.5 - One program and two financing sources at the service of the territories:

With the aim of supporting the activities of project promoters, INTERREG Caribbean articulates two European funds:

- Approximately €64 million from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) are intended to support the activities of European project promoters (Guadeloupe, French Guiana, Martinique, Saint-Martin) engaged in an INTERREG Caribbean project
- In addition, INTERREG Caribbean benefits from a European Development Fund envelope (EDF) which has an amount of €2.941 million intended to support the activities of the Caribbean partners of an INTERREG Caribbean project.

The specific axes and objectives opened under this CEI, as well as the thematic, financial framework, the general conditions of eligibility are defined hereafter.

Some specific eligibility conditions and selection principles are detailed in point 3.

B- Thematic framework and eligible actions:

The project should enable to:

- And/or support the networking network of innovation, technology transfer and entrepreneurship accompaniment actors (cluster networks, nurseries, incubators, technopoles etc.).

Within the framework of the project, the lead partner shall imperatively define and put in place a method and/or tools that will enable him to follow up the INTERREG Caribbean program **output indicators**:

- Indicator 1: number of companies benefiting from support.
- Indicator 2: Number of companies benefiting from subsidies.
- Indicator 3: number of companies benefiting from a non-financial support.

NB: The value of indicator 1 is equal to the sum of indicators 2 and 3.

Axis 10 – Reinforce the human capital

Specific Objective 16 - Increase student and professional mobility within the Caribbean space.

A-Geographic framework

The CEI is open to projects involving

- .a lead partner located in Guadeloupe, French Guyana, Martinique or Saint Martin and a partner(s) located in : Guadeloupe, French Guyana, Martinique, or Saint-Martin
- and MANDATORY at least one country or territory from the following list: Antigua and Barbuda; Anguilla; Aruba; Barbados; Bermuda; Bahamas; Belize; Bonaire; British Virgin Islands; Curacao; Colombia; Costa Rica; Cuba; Dominica; Dominican Republic; Grenada; Guatemala; Guyana; Honduras; Haiti; Jamaica; St Kitts and Nevis; Cayman Islands; Saint Lucia; Montserrat; Mexico; Nicaragua; Panama; Porto Rico; Suriname; El Salvador; Turks and Caicos Islands; Trinidad and Tobago; St Vincent and the Grenadines; Venezuela; St Martin; Saba; St Eustatius; St Barthelemy.

B- Thematic framework and eligible actions:

The project should enable the setting up of:

- Erasmus-type university mobility projects at the Caribbean scale;
- Leonardo type mobility projects at the Caribbean scale (on training and vocational education systems);
- Caribbean-wide Grundtvig mobility projects (on adult education);
- Conditions favoring the development of a regionally coordinated training offer in relation to the pertinent economic sectors of the Caribbean economy (e.g. renewable energies and energy management, tourism, agri-foodstuffs);
- Co-graduating training courses (see co-supervision of thesis, double masters degree on the model of integrated training in political science UAG-UWI-IEP Bordeaux, etc.).;
- ICT-based distance training course programs (e-learning with platforms for course materials and videoconferencing for courses and exams).

As part of the project, the lead partner will have to define and set up a method and/or tools that will enable him to ensure the monitoring of the INTERREG Caribbean program's **output indicators**:

• Number of participants in cross-border mobility initiatives

Similarly, the lead partner shall also ensure that the project will contribute directly or indirectly to increasing the value of the result indicator of the INTERREG Caribbean program:

• Number of international cooperation agreements with the Caribbean signed by Caribbean universities and regional vocational training operators.

3 – Project ideas selection:

3.1 – Projects execution period:

In view of the context in the end of the programming, and in order not to risk putting the beneficiaries in difficulty due to the complexity of the closure process, the Managing Authority, jointly with the partnership, has defined sound management strict rules applicable to projects submitted under CEI No 2.

For this purpose, it is expected that the projects to be selected in the framework this CEI have fully completed their activities by December 31st, 2022. They will then be able to finalize the administrative and financial process of expenditure feedback by February 28th, 2023.

As such, particular attention shall be paid to the administrative and financial capacity of the partnership and the lead partner upon selection of the projects: the capacity to implement the project within the time limit given will have to be demonstrated.

3.2 -Taking expenses into account expenses relating to administrative and office expenses:

These expenses will be taken into account by applying the flat rate defined in Article 68 paragraph 1 point b of EU Regulation No 1303/2013. In the case of indirect costs valorised by the applicant, these will therefore be calculated by applying the flat rate of 15% of the eligible direct personnel costs.

3.3 -Opportunity opinion on project ideas:

Project ideas submitted under the CEI will be subject to a technical instruction by the Joint Secretariat team, based on a pre-project analysis grid. This analysis will mainly focus on:

- the coherence of the project idea with the program's strategy (axis, specific objective, performance and results indicators);
- compliance with at least two of the following four cooperation criteria: common design, common implementation, common financing, common headcount endowment;
- the structuring nature of the partnership (pertinence of the partnership, federating nature);
- the administrative and financial soundness of the lead structure;
- the concrete results expected from the project and their innovative dimension.

The project ideas and technical analysis will then be presented to the members of the program's selection committee who will give a positive or negative opportunity opinion.

Further details concerning the forecast deadlines can be found in point 4 below.





3.4 – The teachings from the CEI No. 1

In CEI No 1, the selection of project ideas by the members of the selection committee was guided by the following orientations and considerations:

a- General considerations:

- On this 3rd generation of INTERREG Caribbean program, the members of the selection committee insisted on the need **to rise in power**: the will is therefore **not to sprinkle the funds**, but to select structuring projects, i.e. projects with a truly regional vocation, which are inclusive and federating. This is reflected in particular by the pertinence and federative dimension of the partnership that is going to be the basis of the project (pre-projects where the partnership was too weak, not federative enough and not diversified enough have hence been discarded) and by the fact that the objective of the project makes it possible to respond to several of the issues identified in the framework of the program (strategic axes and specific objectives).
- Some projects, relevant as regard to the program's strategy but for which the administrative
 and financial capacities of the lead partners have been deemed insufficient, were also
 discarded.
- Project ideas brought by structures exclusively located in non-European territory without an
 identified lead partner in European territory were rejected. Similarly, project ideas
 submitted by project promoters located in European territory without an identified partner
 in non-European territory were rejected. An INTERREG Caribbean project necessarily
 involves a partnership between European and non-European structures in the Caribbean.
- In addition, still in adequacy with this desire to rise in power, priority was given to structuring and operational projects whose repercussions are identifiable and measurable.
 The partners insisted on their willingness to finance lasting projects, and not punctual or event-driven projects.
- The members of the selection committee insisted on the vocation of the INTERREG Caribbean program to support cooperation between the territories of the area. Projects which are similar to export aid, development aid or humanitarian aid are hence not in adequacy with the principle of reciprocity which is the basis of the program. Priority is given to structuring projects with identifiable repercussions for the territories, not only for the enterprises supported. The program's vocation is not intended to accompany enterprises in penetrating a new market
- At last, some project ideas intersected with each other: it was therefore proposed to the project leaders to get closer and to mutualize their actions, in order to design a **project that** is truly federative and on a larger scope.

b- Considerations by thematic:

<u>Natural and cultural heritage</u>: culture is certainly an area of cooperation, but on this new
programming it must allow an economic development of the sector of activity concerned,
support job creations to come. This is why the choice was made not to support purely eventbased pre-projects, relating to the organization of inter-Caribbean festivals for instance;





- <u>Health</u>: within the framework of health, telemedicine has bearing to real stakes and needs in the regional space (diabetes, hypertension, prostate cancer, breast cancer...) and allowing a real cooperation in the regional area;
- Renewable energies: the members of the selection committee have expressed their wish to support a project aimed at the emergence of a center of excellence aimed at sharing training, know-how, student paths in matters of renewable energies, etc.
- Human Capital: the partners wished to agree on the vocation of the human capital axis, so that it would not become a "catch-all" axis that would support projects that could not be financed in the framework of other funds. Thus, in so far as training is concerned, it was proposed to support the mobility of persons and mastery of languages in order to increase human capital. On the other hand, pre-projects enabling training centers to extend their field of competence to the Caribbean were not retained. In this sector, care should be taken not to support projects that would fall within the framework of the ESF. At last, the partners indicated that the idea of federating the diverse stakeholders in mobility seemed to them to be pertinent.

3.5 - INTERREG Caribbean projects selection:

Thereafter, project ideas that have received a positive opportunity notice will be accompanied by the Joint Secretariat with a view to submitting a complete application file.

With regard to the selection criteria:

Generally speaking, as the INTERREG Caribbean program is a cooperation program providing financial support under the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), operations are to be selected taking into account:

- the pertinence and added value of regional cooperation;
- the articulation and complementarity with the development strategies and financing instruments of the French ORs, regional partner organizations, the OCTs and other Member States of the regional organizations;
- their subscription in the thematics of the program's intelligent specialization strategies of Community territories;

the expected results for the territories.

More specifically, each application file will be subjected to an examination by the Joint Secretariat in three steps:

- 1- Completion of the pre-project form : (all sections of the form must be filled in)
- 2- **Regulatory analysis**: the eligibility of the project and of the actions foreseen within the framework of the project, the respect of National and European regulatory provisions will be analyzed.
- **3- Analysis of the project's quality**: the strategic and operational quality of the project will be examined on the basis of the following criteria:

At the end of this instruction, the project will be presented during the Technical Committee (or EDF-ERDF Technical Committee for project ideas articulating the two funds): the administrative representatives of the program's partner organizations will give <u>a technical opinion</u> on the project.

At last, the Selection Committee will meet and take <u>a decision</u> on whether or not to select the project.





4 - Process and deadline for decision taking:

4.1 - Nomination Submission and Review Process

Within the framework of a Call for Expression of Interest (CEI), the procedure is organized in two phases.

Phase One - Submission and Opportunity Notice on Project Ideas

Applicants are invited to submit their project ideas, providing a clear overview of the project including:

- a summary of the project,
- the overall objective,
- the axis concerned,
- the partnership and its coherence with the project,
- the indicative budget.

The project idea must be formalized in the framework of the pre-project sheet available on the INTERREG Caribbean program website. This pre-project form shall have to be transmitted in French and English, together with the required supporting documents, to the Joint Secretariat of the INTERREG Caribbean Program, both:

The Joint Secretariat will receive the pre-projects and propose to the Selection Committee an analysis of these project ideas.

The Selection Committee shall meet to give an opinion of opportunity on the pre-projects, taking into account the comments that will have been made to them.

Projects that have received a positive opinion of opportunity will be able to move on to the second stage of the submission procedure.

Second phase - Submission of a complete application file

Depending on the decisions taken by the Program's Selection Committee, the retained candidates will then be invited to prepare a complete application file. They will be liable to comply with a submission deadline which will be specified on the notification of positive opportunity notice.

The Selection Committee shall take at last a final decision on whether or not to program the project and the financial support that will be granted to it.





4.2 -Forecast deadlines:

Project holders are invited to submit their project ideas until August 15th, 2020.

The project ideas received within the set times will then be analyzed by the Joint Secretariat and will be presented to the members of the Selection Committee in October 2020, for an opportunity notice (the precise date will be communicated later on).

Projects that have received a positive opportunity notice will be accompanied by the Joint Secretariat and the Regional Contact Persons with a view to submit a complete application on December 31st, 2020. The deadline to be met for the submission of the full application will be specified to them in the notification of positive opinion from the selection committee.

These complete applications will then be examined by the Joint Secretariat and will be presented again to the members of the selection committee who will decide on their programming at the beginning of 2021.
